

# FLEECE MEASUREMENT SERVICE GUIDELINES







Thank you for selecting NZWTA Ltd as your trusted fleece testing provider. Please become familiar with our fleece testing guidelines below to minimize the risk of any problems. If you have any queries, please contact your local NZWTA representative (see details on Page 2) or the Napier laboratory on 06 835 1086 (option 1).

### **SERVICE SUMMARY**

Our fleece testing service commences once you contact NZWTA Ltd or complete the online fleece testing request form (on the NZWTA website). You will then be sent individual sample bags and sample ID tickets corresponding to your fleece testing request.

### **SAMPLES**

Each fleece sample should weigh a minimum of 15-20 grams. This is generally 'a large handful' and should be enough to fill a coffee mug (see picture right). Smaller samples may be incompatible with testing equipment and therefore unable to be measured.

Samples should ideally be taken from the mid-side position of the animal (see picture right). This position has been found to be the most representative of sites across the fleece.






Fig 1: Sampling site and volume of wool

## **TICKETS**

## Details to go on tickets

Sample ID tickets will be provided for each group/mob that you specify in your fleece testing request. You will only need to fill in the **Tag Number** (animal ID) section on each ticket (see example on Page 2). However, if you require clean fleece weight to be tested/reported, you will also need to fill in the **greasy fleece weight** section.

If you are using electronic ID tags (stickers) for the sample ID, please put these on the back of the ID ticket. It is important that you do not cover the bar code (Lab Sample ID) at the bottom of the ticket.

# Testing Requirements

Please check your testing requirements for each group/mob are correct. These are identified on your confirmation email from NZWTA and in the bottom-left of the sample ID tickets. If there are any errors, please inform us immediately.

# **FACT SHEET**


Place each individual sample in a separate sample bag along with the appropriate sample ID ticket. Please do not write on or stick labels on the sample bag. It is very important that the correct tickets are used for each group/mob.

## In particular:

- Do not mix tickets between groups/mobs (ie use ewe hogget tickets in the ram hogget group)
- Do not use older tickets (eg left over from last year). Throw away any unused tickets as these cannot be used for other groups in the future.
- Please have the ticket facing out so they can be read through the sample bag)

Secure each sample bag so that the contents cannot spill out and mix during transit.

#### FLEECE TESTING SERVICE TIMES AND RECEIVING RESULTS

Test results are normally available within 10 days of receipt at our laboratory. In some instances, the completion of testing may take a little longer (eg larger batches or during the peak testing season).

Test results from fleece testing will generally be emailed to you immediately following completion of testing. These will be in a Microsoft Excel file. A printed copy of the test results can also be posted to you if requested.
